- \$ 27,902 STAF (transportation contract)



19 WHEREAS, the Placer County Transportation Planning Agency has been designated by the  
20 Secretary of the State of California, Business and Transportation Agency, as the transportation  
21 planning agency for Placer County excluding that portion of the County in the Lake Tahoe  
22 Basin, pursuant to the provisions of the Transportation Development Act of 1971, Chapter  
1400, Statutes of 1971; and Chapters 161 and 1002, Statutes of 1990; and Chapters 321 and  
322, Statutes of 1982; and

23 WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Placer County Transportation Planning Agency,  
24 under the provisions of the Act, to review transportation claims and to make allocations of  
money from the State Transit Assistance Fund based on the claims; and

25 WHEREAS, the Auditor of each county is required to pay monies in the fund to the claimants  
26 pursuant to allocation instructions received from the Placer County Transportation Planning  
Agency; and

1 WHEREAS, the Placer County Transportation Planning Agency has reviewed the claim for  
2 funds established to be available in the State Transit Assistance fund of Placer County and has  
3 made the following findings and allocations:

- 4 1. The claimant's proposed expenditures are in conformity with the Regional  
5 Transportation Plan.
- 6 2. The level of passenger fares and charges is sufficient to enable the operator or transit  
7 service claimant to meet the fare revenue requirements of Public Utilities Code Sections  
8 99268.2, 99268.3, 99268.4, 99268.5, and 99268.9, as they may be applicable to the  
9 claimant.
- 10 3. The claimant is making full use of federal funds available under the Urban Mass  
11 Transportation Act of 1964, as amended.
- 12 4. The sum of the claimant's allocations from the State Transit Assistance Fund and from  
13 the Local Transportation Fund does not exceed the amount the claimant is eligible to  
14 receive during the fiscal year.
- 15 5. Priority consideration has been given to claims to offset reductions in federal operating  
16 assistance and the unanticipated increase in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public  
17 transportation services, and to meet high priority regional, countywide, or areawide  
18 public transportation needs.
- 19 6. The regional entity may allocate funds to an operator for the purposes specified in  
20 Section 6730 only if, in the resolution allocating the funds, it also finds the following:
  - 21 a) The operator has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity  
22 improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.  
23 This finding shall make specific reference to the improvements recommended  
24 and to the efforts made by the operator to implement them.
  - 25 b) For an allocation made to an operator for its operating cost, the operator is not  
26 precluded by any contract entered into on or after June 28, 1979, from  
27 employment of part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of  
28 persons operating under a franchise or license.
  - c) A certification by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying  
that the operator is in compliance with Section 1808.1 of the Vehicle Code, as  
required in Public Utilities Code Section 99251. The certification shall have  
been completed within the last 13 months, prior to filing claims.
  - d) The operator is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities  
Code Section 99314.6.

Allocation to the Town of Loomis of \$27,902 in State Transit Assistance Funds (PUC 99313 &  
99314) for transit purposes.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that allocation instructions have been prepared in accordance with the above and are hereby approved and that the Chairman is authorized to sign said allocation instructions and to issue the instructions to the County Auditor to pay the claimants in accordance with the above allocations.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the claimant be notified of the Placer County Transportation Planning Agency's action on their claim.
