

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
PLACER COUNTY AIRPORT LAND USE COMMISSION (ALUC)
LEGAL NOTICE**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held by the Placer County Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC) on the date and time noted below to consider adoption of new Airport Land Use Compatibility Plans (ALUCPs) and Negative Declarations for Auburn Municipal and Lincoln Regional airports and approval of a Notice of Exemption for Blue Canyon Airport.

The Placer County Transportation Planning Agency, which serves as the ALUC and the lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act, proposes to adopt Negative Declarations for the ALUCPs for Auburn Municipal and Lincoln Regional Airports and approve a Notice of Exemption for Blue Canyon Airport. The proposed project involves updating the current Placer County Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan which was adopted in February 2014. The need for the update arose primarily because of new airport layout plans (ALPs) for Auburn Municipal and Lincoln Regional Airports recently adopted by the cities of Auburn and Lincoln, respectively. These new ALPs necessitated modification to the compatibility zones and policies for these two airports. No changes are proposed to the airport-specific compatibility policies for Blue Canyon Airport.

The preparation of compatibility plans for public-use airports is required by the California State Aeronautics Act (Public Utilities Code Section 21670 *et seq.*). The purpose of the ALUCP is to promote compatibility between an airport and the land uses in its vicinity to the extent that these areas have not already been devoted to incompatible uses. The ALUCP establishes a set of noise, safety, airspace protection, and overflight policies and associated compatibility criteria that the ALUC will use to evaluate the compatibility of land use proposals within the airport vicinity, as well as long-range airport development plans. Neither the proposed ALUCP nor the ALUC have authority over existing land uses, airport operations, or state, federal, or tribal lands.

The proposed ALUCPs are regulatory in nature, and neither the project—the adoption of the ALUCPs—nor its subsequent implementation by local agencies will lead directly or indirectly to physical development or to any physical change to the environment. Based on the analysis performed, adoption and implementation of the proposed ALUCPs will not create a potentially significant effect on the environment. Said public hearing will be heard on:
